WHAT IS THE CCA?

The Conservative Councillors' Association is the official voice of Conservatives in local government.

The CCA exists to provide a strong and unified voice for all Conservative councillors within the Party and in the wider community.

The CCA supports councillors in their important role and provides them with the tools to both work effectively on behalf of local residents and to campaign successfully as Conservatives.

WHO RUNS THE CCA?

The CCA is managed by the Local Government Board.

The Board is elected annually by CCA Members with the exception of the LGA Conservative Group Leader, the CCA Secretary and the Shadow Minister for Local Government.



CCA EVENTS

The CCA holds a number of events throughout the year.

Our main event, the annual Conservative Local Government Conference is attended by CCA Members, Shadow Ministers and key stakeholders in local government, and provides an excellent opportunity for discussion on the latest developments in local government.

The CCA hosts a number of fringe events at the Conservative Party Conference including a briefing session with our Parliamentary Local Government Team and hosts a Councillors' Lounge.

We also run a number of networking and training events throughout the year, including campaign training sessions, public speaking courses and a new councillors' training day. We also arrange an annual post-election day for Group Leaders.
